During five days each spring, dozens of your neighbors gather to sit on Allocation Panels and hear presentations from agencies and clients who are seeking support from United Way of Southern Chester County (UWSCC). While these volunteer panelists are chosen to represent the rich diversity of our community and each brings their own unique perspective to the table, they are uniformly impressed with the efficiency and effectiveness of this process.

Fritz Heinz, a retired medical professor, volunteered for the first time this spring.

"I was impressed with the process and the methodologies. I served on study panels for other things but never one like this. The format, the data collection, the organization process and the hearing itself was so impressive. This process is a concentrated effort at sorting out what applicants are trying to accomplish

and bringing together multiple perspectives to accomplish this."

He also took away a broader understanding of his new community.

"Being on a panel opened my eyes to the community...and to all the good stuff that goes on because of the wonders of the United Way."

Jeff Jury has sat on allocation panels for five years and has seen the actual effectiveness of the process.

"The panelists get a view of an organization's value to the community and hear directly from the agencies about the needs and from the clients who have been helped...this allows the panelists to give UWSCC solid direction on how the funds should be allocated."

He has also been impressed with the outcome of UWSCC development efforts.

"I have seen an agency go from one guy with a cause and no accounting at all to growing into a self-sustaining agency with a full board and accounting processes... due to United Way's mentoring."
