Dear Friends,


As we launch our new fiscal year, United Way of Southern Chester County is Mobilizing for ALICE. ALICE stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed—households who earn above the federal poverty line but still struggle to make ends meet. These are hardworking families living paycheck to paycheck, often unable to cover basic needs like housing, childcare, food, or healthcare. Nearly 30% of households in Chester County fall under the ALICE threshold.

In 2025, we invested \$650,000 in programs that ensure gaps are being bridged for our most vulnerable neighbors. We are working hand in hand with local nonprofits to provide the tools, services, and opportunities families need to move from surviving to thriving.

But we cannot do this work alone. Costs continue to rise, wages remain stagnant, and many programs are losing critical government funding. Now more than ever, we need our community to come together to ensure that every family has the support they need to build a stable, independent future.

Mobilizing for ALICE: Building Resilient, Thriving Communities Together

United Way of Southern Chester County is proud to launch our FY2025–2026 Annual Campaign, with the theme: **Mobilizing for ALICE: Building Resilient, Thriving Communities Together.**

This theme reflects our **shared mission to mobilize communities to action** so all can thrive. It shines a light on ALICE households—those who work hard yet still cannot afford basic expenses. In Pennsylvania, ALICE represents 40% of households, and in **Chester County nearly 3 in 10 families fall under the ALICE threshold.** These are our neighbors—families juggling multiple jobs, seniors on fixed incomes, and young workers struggling to keep up with rising costs.

In 2025, United Way of Southern Chester County invested \$650,000 to strengthen the programs and partnerships that bridge the gap for ALICE families. Together, we are working to create a community where every household has the tools and opportunities to achieve independence.

Our investments focus on four key impact areas:

Healthy Community: Ensuring equitable access to healthcare and well-being.
 This includes maternal and child health, nutrition and food security, mental health support, and chronic/infectious disease prevention.

- <u>Youth Opportunity:</u> Preparing young people to realize their full potential, with programs that span childcare, early education, after-school and summer learning, literacy development, and career readiness.
- <u>Financial Security</u>: Building sustainable futures by supporting adult education, job training, affordable housing, financial coaching, and homelessness prevention.
- <u>Community Resiliency</u>: Addressing urgent needs through 211 crisis hotlines, emergency response and recovery, disaster preparedness, and environmental sustainability.

This campaign year, we are calling on our community to join us in Mobilizing for ALICE. Together, we can ensure families don't just get by—but thrive.


