United Way of Southern Chester County Announces Allocations for Nonprofits in Fiscal Year 2024-2025

Southern Chester County, May 15– United Way of Southern Chester County (UWSCC) is proud to announce the allocation of \$750,000 to support 28 programs provided by 21 nonprofit agencies in Southern Chester County. These allocations are vital in meeting critical needs across our community and reflect UWSCC's commitment to addressing key issues through strategic funding.

UWSCC's support spans across three focus areas: Education, Crisis Intervention, and Family Stability and Health. This year's allocations are as follows:

- Crisis Intervention: 14 programs totaling \$403,260
- Education: 7 programs totaling \$184,300
- Health and Family Stability: 7 programs totaling \$162,440

These allocations were awarded on Wednesday, May 15th, during our annual meeting. The meeting was attended by Board members, community stakeholders, and representatives from the nonprofit organizations receiving awards.

"The allocations awarded represent our ongoing commitment to supporting programs that make a meaningful impact in Southern Chester County," said Terry Vodery, CEO of UWSCC. "Through strategic investments in education, crisis intervention, and family stability and health, we aim to create positive change and foster a thriving community for all."
